An Introduction to Fr. John Echewodo

John Ikechukwu Echewodo is my name. I am Nigerian by birth, an Australian by naturalisation and a Brisbane Priest by virtue of Priestly ordination. I was born on 31st October 1975. I am blessed with five brothers, an older sister and a twin Sister. My Parents, Cletus and Felicia, have both passed on. My dad, Mr. Cletus Echewodo Ajah, died in 2006 and my Mum, Mrs. Felicia Uloji, in 2009.

My journey to the priesthood started in Nigeria and with it came many years of seminary training, academic studies



and qualifications. As part of my formal studies, I obtained a Bachelor of Arts in Philosophy from Imo State University, Owerri, Imo State, Nigeria and another degree also in Philosophy from Seat of Wisdom Major Seminary, Owerri, which is an affiliate Institute of the Pontifical Urban University, Rome.

When I arrived in Australia in 2007, I started and completed a Bachelor of Arts in Theology from the Brisbane College of Theology and later a Masters of Arts in Theology from the Australian Catholic University. I also hold a Graduate Certificate in Management of Not-For-Profit Organisations which I obtained through Australian Catholic University in 2019. I was ordained to the presbyterate on 8th December, 2010, at the Cathedral of Saint Stephen, Brisbane, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God and our Mother.

After my ordination, I was appointed to Surfers Paradise Parish, where I spent two and half years as an Associate Pastor. My time there was filled with wonderful and memorable experiences. Next came Saint Mary's, Beaudesert, where I found a home among the country people for over 3 years. At the completion of my time at Beaudesert, I was appointed as Parish Priest of Saint Mary's, Coomera where my pastoral ministry was further deepened and enriched. While the seminary may, perhaps, be regarded as the nursery grounds for priestly training and formation, it is my view that is in the Parish among the People of God that the heart and soul of the pastor is prepared for pastoral ministry. My time at Coomera shaped and formed me to a large extent into the pastor I think I am becoming, and I have no doubt that my ongoing formation and training will continue as I pitch my tent amongst you here on the north side of Brisbane.

As I was packing my gear for the big move to Our Lady of the Angels Parish, Chermside West and Wavell Heights, I came across some of my old files which contained stories of my earliest days in Australia. One of these was in the Courier Mail entitled: "Church turns to Africa for priests of future." The story evoked deep of feelings of nostalgia for my earliest days in Australia and the warm welcome and hospitality I received from parishioners of Saint Paschal's, Wavell Heights. Interestingly in 2007 when I arrived in Australia, I lived in the house where I am living now, and Saint Paschal's was my first Parish in Australia. Thus, there is a sense of inner peace and comfort in coming to Our Lady of the Angels as Parish Priest. The inner peace I feel stems from knowing that I am not coming as a total stranger but as one of you. My appointment is like a home-coming as I am returning to my roots, my first home in Australia. I have read the reports which came out of the parish consultation facilitated by some members of the College of Consultors before my appointment. From the reports, there are noticeable and understandable pains and sadness over the sudden and unexpected departure of Fr Paul Chackanikunnel CMI from the Parish.

This is a testament of your love for Fr Paul. With his departure, Mons John Grace maintained the administrative and pastoral life of the Parish with the help of Very Rev Fr Dan Ryan. We are grateful to these pastors for their dedicated ministry.

As your Parish Priest, I come to you not only as one of you, but also as your spiritual leader, a steward of your temporal goods, a son, a brother, a friend and your servant-leader. The first time I came to the Parish office, I was warmly welcomed by Kerstin, Dianne and Margaret. I also received an overwhelming welcome on the night of the casual meeting with some members of the parish. I cannot say with any sense of certainty what the future holds for us; however, I can say with great conviction, that God holds our future. Faith is not knowing what holds the future, but knowing **Who** holds the future, and for us, it is always God. With your help and cooperation and, of course, by the grace of God, I will do my best to serve you as together we will continue the good works God has accomplished through the ministry of Fr. Gerard, Fr Paul and Mons John Grace and those who preceded them.

I am quite humbled by the honour and the privilege, Archbishop Mark Coleridge and the College of Consultors, have given me to lead and serve you, as your Parish Priest. I am grateful. May the Blessed Virgin Mary under whose patronage this parish thrives always accompany us on our journey of faith. May her loving and maternal hands and intercessions always lead me as I serve you as your Priest and Pastor.



• Do you have any brothers or sisters? If so, how do you get along? Do you ever exchange angry words? How do you reconcile?

• How about your parents or guardians – how do you get along with them? What happens after angry words?

• How about your friends – do you ever exchange angry words with them? How do you reconcile?

• Are your tolerance level and your apology style with your friends different from those with your brothers and sisters or with your parents or guardians? If so, how do they differ?

A lot of rage and violence are expressed in songs on the radio and in movies and TV shows. Many teenagers prefer to claim that watching violent shows or listening to violent songs has no connection to the violence in our world, but many others know better.

• What parallel do you see between the amount of violence and rage in the media and the amount of violence in the real world? What is the connection?

• What do you know of 'copycat crimes' that have occurred because someone is imitating an act seen on television, in the movies or in the news?
