## SUNDAY 16th July 2023 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Dear Parishioners, Friends and Visitors,

The gospel of last weekend opened with Jesus saying, "...I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children," (Matthew 11:25). Worthy of mention is the fact that God has no favourites, neither does God exclude the learned and the wise from discovering the inexhaustible riches and mysteries of His



Kingdom. However, in making this cry of exultation, Christ affirms that the poor, the lowly and the humble were the first to welcome and receive the good news - and it is for them that Christ found, in the use of parables, appropriate pedagogy and teaching tools.

In the next three weekends, we will be reading and reflecting on the 13th Chapter of Matthew's gospel which contains the seven parables about the kingdom of God. In this weekend's gospel, we contemplate the first of these - the parable of the sower. Scripture tells us that Christ says: "a farmer went out to sow his seeds. As he was scattering the seeds, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Some fell on rocky places, where they did not have much soil, and sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, they were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked them. Still other seeds fell on rich soil, where they produced their crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. Whoever has ears, let them hear," (Matthew 13:3-9).

Christ told this parable at a difficult moment in His life - when He was thrown out of His home country of Nazareth; when He was treated like a mad person at Capernaum; when His disciples were trying to desert Him; and when His teachings seemed to have met with opposition and rejection. For Him, conditions were extremely harsh. However, despite all obstacles, the word of God still yields abundant fruit because the Word holds in itself the irresistible force of life.

God speaks to us every day in a variety of ways. However, in the Mass, during the Liturgy of the Word, God speaks to us through the proclamation and preaching of the word. The fruitfulness of the word of God proclaimed and preached depends on our internal disposition. The human heart is the soil of the gospel. It has been said that the human heart is the engine of the human body, responsible for pumping lifesustaining blood via a 60,000-mile (97,000 km)-long network of vessels. It works ceaselessly, beating 100,000 times a day, 40 million times a year—in total clocking up to three billion heartbeats over an average lifetime. The human heart is to the human body, what the spiritual heart is to the seeds of the Word of God - rich soil for growth. As we can take care of our physical heart through good diet, exercise and routine check-ups, we can also take care of our heart spiritually. There are many things which can prevent the human heart from being a fertile ground for the word such as worry, distractions, sin, pride, or even prejudice.

In the days of this coming week, may we take care to guard our hearts with due diligence and ensure that we make them fertile soil where the seed of life grows and bears fruit – thirty fold, sixty fold and even a hundred fold.

## The July 2023 Standard for Volunteer Safeguarding Accreditation Requirements

The Archdiocese has just released the July 2023 Standard for Volunteer Safeguarding Accreditation Requirements. Following are the main points that interests the Parish:

- Parish, ministries, and services are to reserve the right to request any individual satisfy safeguarding accreditation requirements, at any time, if deemed necessary or appropriate.
  - A) The primary consideration in determining volunteer safeguarding accreditation requirements must be the safety, protection, and well-being of the children and adults-at-risk.
- Children 14 years of age or older may be appointed to a volunteer role with the <u>prior written consent of the parents/guardians</u>. Parents are required to register their children as volunteers and have both the child and their parents/guardians co-sign the volunteer registration form.

#### **Legal Compliance**

Parishes, ministries, and services must comply with all statutory/legal screening or accreditation requirements.

#### **Working with Children Clearances (Blue Cards)**

All 'religious representatives' are required to hold a current working with children Blue Card.

Parishes, ministries and services must not engage or employ, or continue to engage or employ a person (including a volunteer) in child-related work or activities until that person's application for a working with children Blue Card is approved by Blue Card Services and they can produce their Blue Card or official correspondence to that effect (i.e. No Card -No Start). The person's Blue Card or official correspondence from Blue Card Services must be sighted before parishes, ministries or services can allow a person to commence child-related work or activities. If there is doubt about the status of a person's Blue Card parishes, ministries and services should contact the People & Culture (HR) office to confirm the validity of the Blue Card before allowing the person to commence or continue in child-related work or activities.

Parishes, ministries, and services must not engage or employ, or continue to engage or employ a Queensland registered teacher or Queensland police officer in child-related work or activities unless the person holds a working with children Blue Card or has made a working with children Blue Card exemption application. Where an exemption application is made, parishes, ministries and services are to confirm the application has been lodged with Blue Card Services before allowing the person to commence child-related work or activities.

Parishes, ministries, and services must not allow a 'restricted person' (including a volunteer) to be involved in child-related work or activities.

Section 176H - Working with Children (Risk Management and Screening) Act 2000

#### **National Police Checks**

All volunteers who are: Counters, Finance Council Members, Admin Personal, and Key-holders to Parish property, must have a national police check, not more than 3 years old. Aged Care Accountability Principles 1998 made pursuant to the Aged Care Act

# From eSafety Commission – July 2023 Protecting our (increasingly younger) children from cyberbullying

The internet has given children and young people new opportunities to learn, play and socialise. However, this increased online presence, especially since the Covid-19 pandemic, also exposes them to new harms and risks.

Concerningly, reports to eSafety's cyberbullying complaints team show younger children are increasingly experiencing negative online behaviour. Reports of serious cyberbullying of children between the ages of eight and 13 years has more than tripled compared to pre-pandemic 2019 – jumping from a little over 200 complaints in 2019 to almost 740 in 2022.

With Term 3 just around the corner, take a few minutes to <u>learn</u> more about cyberbullying – what it is, ways to protect your child, and how to get help if your child experiences it.
