Dear Parishioners, Friends and Visitors,

Over the last couple of weekends, we have been reading and reflecting on some of the parables which Jesus Christ directed against the chief priests and elders of the people. In the gospel chosen for this weekend, Christ likened the kingdom of God to a king who threw a feast for his son's wedding. Undoubtedly the invited guests in this parable,



who refused to honour the invitation stand for the Jewish people. God chose the Jewish people to be God's own, yet when God's Son, Jesus Christ, came into the world to be the saviour of the world, the Jews refused to accept Him or believe in Him. In other words, they contemptuously refused the invitation Jesus Christ offered them. They refused to accept Christ as the Messiah because they wrongly assumed that Christ did not fulfill the messianic prophecies, nor embody the qualities they expected in the Messiah.

According to the Jewish eschatology, the Messiah would be a future Jewish king from the Davidic line, someone anointed with holy oil to rule the Jewish people during the Messianic Age and world to come. The Jews expected the Messiah to be a political leader who would overthrow the Roman rulers and establish Jerusalem as the centre of power and government. Also, the Messiah was not expected to associate with tax-collectors, sinners or gentiles. In His ministry, Christ associated and ate with all these outcasts. As a result of Christ's inclusive form of ministry which did not meet any of their Messianic expectations, the Jews could find no reason to accept Christ as the Messiah.

On the contrary, the people on the highways and byways who represent the tax-collectors, prostitutes, sinners and the Gentiles with no formal invitation into the kingdom of God, were open to Christ's invitation to be part of the wedding feast. They were the ones who received surprised invitations which they wholeheartedly accepted - and were admitted into the wedding feast in the kingdom of God.

During the 2021 Census, it was reported that almost 40 per cent (38.9 per cent) of Australia's population reported having no religion. This shows that about 10 million people have no religious affiliation in a country that is nominally Christian. While 'no religion' might not necessarily mean 'not having in faith God', it is indisputably true that Christianity which used to be dominant is in serious decline. Today it appears that Christianity or the Good News has been reduced to mere rumour with no tangible, existential implications on everyday living. God's gracious invitation is an invitation to a feast as joyous as any wedding feast. God invites us to a life of joy and it is joy we reject when we refuse that loving invitation. What else could keep and sustain human life with its apparent challenges and problems but an active and living faith in God. As human beings, who are created in God's image and likeness, we don't just want to have God as part and parcel of every-day life - rather we need a 'God in whom we live, move and

(Contd. from P1.) have our being' (Acts 17:28). In one of His metaphorical sayings, Christ said: "Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing," (John 15:5). I know I am preaching to the converted but the converted can change the popular perception of the people who have clicked 'no religion' on the census form. It pays to know God and have a personal relationship with God. However, a personal relationship with God finds tangible expressions not only in daily prayer, adoration and worship but also in the way we live and love. While faith in God does not make life easy, faith makes life possible. The greatest pain felt by people who have vehemently declined the invitation and refused to see the point of developing a relationship with God will lie, not in the things they have unknowingly missed, but in the realisation of what they were offered and chose to decline.

As a Nigerian, who lived over 3 decades of his life in Nigeria and who has lived in Australia for over a decade now, I can unequivocally say that this is one of the best countries in the world. But in this beautiful country, I am sometimes puzzled by the apparent emptiness and desolation which manifests itself in people's lives in so many shapes and forms.

How much do we feel in our lives the inner blessedness, peace, calmness and joy that begins on earth and continues into eternal life with the Lord? As Christians, the joy to which we are invited, is not devoid of pain and sorrow but is a lasting joy which stands unmoved and unshaken in the midst of the vicissitudes of life. Therefore, the choice between accepting or declining the invitation to be part of the feast of heaven on earth which our Catholic participation in the Mass makes possible, is not just a choice between what we want and what we do not want. In fact, it is choice between the most fundamental and essential elements which give authentic and enduring meaning, purpose and direction to life and those which rob human life of its authenticity.



All Souls Day Thursday 2nd November

This year's commemoration of All Souls falls on Thursday 2nd November. There will be the usual 9am morning Mass at Saint Paschal's and another Mass at Saint Gerard's at 7pm in the evening. At the evening Mass at Saint Gerard's, Parishioners will be invited to bring spare copies of funeral booklet, framed, or unframed pictures of deceased family members, relatives, and friends. These items will be displayed on a decorated table and parishioners are encouraged to light a candle as they drop these photos/items on the table.

As we can see, the November Mass envelopes are available for parishioners who would like their deceased family members, relatives, and friends to be remembered in all the Masses throughout the month of November. These names would be typed out, put into PowerPoint, and be displayed before each weekend Mass in November. Since the names of the dead will not be limited to those who have died this year, the office will need time to type and get these names ready before All Souls Day Mass. Parishioners can write on the envelope or write on a separate paper and insert it into the envelop. There is no fee but a donation. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, our prayers for the dead "are capable not only of helping them, but also of making their intercessions for us effective." Furthermore, "it is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins," (2 Maccabees 12:46). May eternal rest grant and perpetual rest be granted to the dead as we pray for them.
